

## FARMINGTON TRIMS PLYMOUTH; MEETS DEARBORN FRIDAY

Plymouth Relegated To Second Place; Farmington And Ypsi Tied For First

Farmington High School's basketball team added another victory to its string last Friday night by defeating Plymouth High 34 to 14. This defeat dropped Plymouth from its tie for first place in the league to second place and left Roosevelt High of Ypsilanti and Farmington the first place contenders, each having won four and lost one game. Farmington meets perhaps its hardest test of the season Friday

night in the Farmington gym, when Dearborn will attempt to pull Farmington from its first-place position. Dearborn is the only team that has defeated Farmington thus far, having won a contest played at Dearborn early in the season by a single point. ## DOCTOR'S REFUSAL TO AID INJURED DENIED

According to Officer Kreeger, Dr. Aschenbrenner said he would come as soon as he could possibly dress and get there, and asked Officer Kreeger in the meantime to inquire as to the condition of the injured men's escort, who replied that he believed they were seriously injured. This was told to Dr. Aschenbrenner, Officer Kreeger stated, and Dr. Aschenbrenner suggested that this being the case, it might be best to rush the men immediately to Receiving Hospital, Detroit, as it would probably be necessary for him to order them to a hospital after he arrived, and their going immediately might prove wisest. Officer Kreeger stated that the road was clear and they might travel through very quickly and probably arrive at the hospital as quickly as he himself could dress and get to the police booth. Officer Kreeger advised that Dr. Aschenbrenner stated clearly he would come at once if the men's escort preferred, and left the decision up to the man driving the car. Officer Kreeger said that the latter decided it would probably be best to start for the hospital at once, and left immediately.

Crum died in Receiving Hospital Monday. It is believed that the Davis, who is supposed as having made the statement regarding supposed refusal of aid, mistook Officer Kreeger for one of the sheriff's men, there having been none of the latter in the vicinity at that time. Officer Kreeger was unable to account for the part of the story regarding "refusal to aid."

Dr. Aschenbrenner, when interviewed, said that Officer Kreeger's report of the incident was correct in every detail, and that he had not, of course, declined or refused to come to the aid of the injured men.


