SUPT. A. G. LEONARD GIVES IMPRESSIVE TALK AT LUNCHEON

School Head Delivers Address On "What Are You Doing?" At Exchange Club

"Home talent" held sway at the Farmington Exchange Club luncheon meeting Wednesday noon. Supt. of Schools Archie G. Leonard providing the program. The Farmington school head delivered a highly impressive talk on "What Are You Doing?"

Supt. Leonard told of a trip of high school seniors to the partially-completed cathedral of St. Albans at Washington, which is to be "America's Westminster Abbey." Supt. Leonard said that after leaving the beautiful edifice he walked up to a man working at a concrete-mixing machine and asked, "What are you doing?" The man replied, "I am mixing mud," and added that it was "an intensely monotonous thing." Walking up to another man at a similar machine, Supt. Leonard related, he asked the same question, and was told, "I am making \$5.00 a day," and added that he too, found the work uninteresting. Supt. Leonard said that he approached a third and asked the same question, but the reply was, "I am building a cathedral."

Supt. Leonard pointed out the difference in these attitudes toward work, and declared that "any occupation must be monotonous and dreary," no matter what the monetary return, if looked at from the viewpoint of the man who is "mixing mud," or "making \$5.00 a day." Every man, however, in whatever work or business, will find interest and happiness therein, Supt. Leonard said, "if he will but look at it from the viewpoint of the man who is 'building a cathedral'."

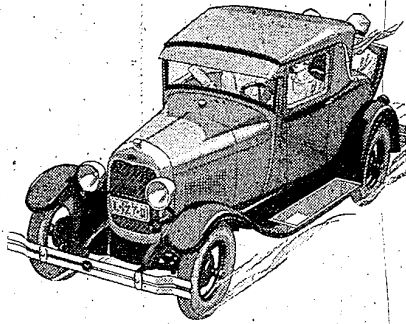
