Alaska Seeks Patrol**Like Canadian Police**

Anchorage, Alaska.—Application for a patrol system like that of the Canadian mounted police has grown out of the recent disappearance of two old-time prospectors.

Kris Kline, one of the missing men, was traced to a crevasse across the glacier trail. The other, Mike Trapke, disappeared while journeying from Tuleme to Sustine, a distance of 90 miles. Both are believed to have perished.

It developed that regulations do not permit a marshal or deputy marshal to leave the beaten highways to investigate alleged crime or to give aid to men in distress, unless so ordered by the district court and by it provided with funds to defray expenses.

A force patterned after the Canadian organization, it is pointed out, would find much useful service to perform in this territory, searching out lost men and running down fugitives.

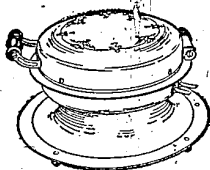
