LIMESTOLL FARM OF EIGHTY ACRES IS SOLD FOR \$70,000

Tam-O-Shanter Golf Club Adds Property To Its Holdings Near Walnut Lake

Louis Limestoll has sold his farm of 80 acres at the corner of the West Bloomfield and Walnut Lake roads, in section 23 of West Bloomfield township to the Tam-O-Shanter Golf Club. The price is understood to have been \$70,000.

The property, which is in the Bloomfield Hills district, across from Walnut Lake, contains a small lake and is ideally located for the purpose of the club. It will give the club, which is composed of men, nearly 400 acres. Mr. Limestoll is contemplating the building of a home on the Orchard Lake road between Maple and Walnut Lake roads. Tentative plans call for a house costing \$12,000.

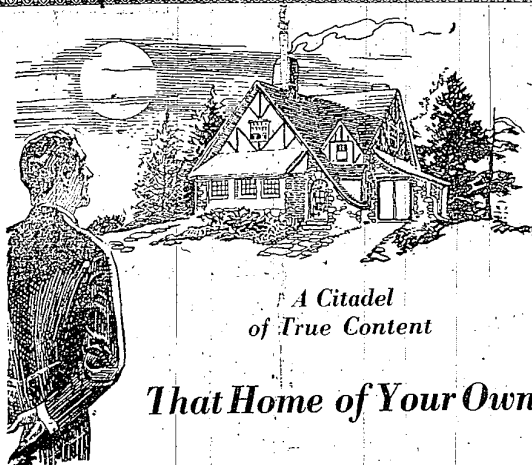

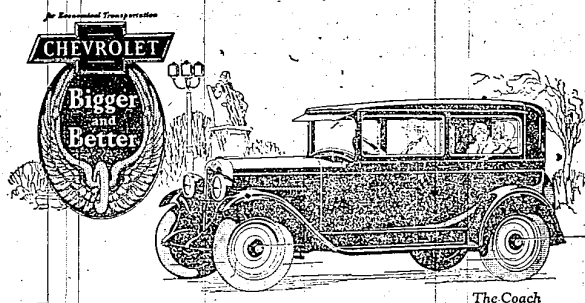
