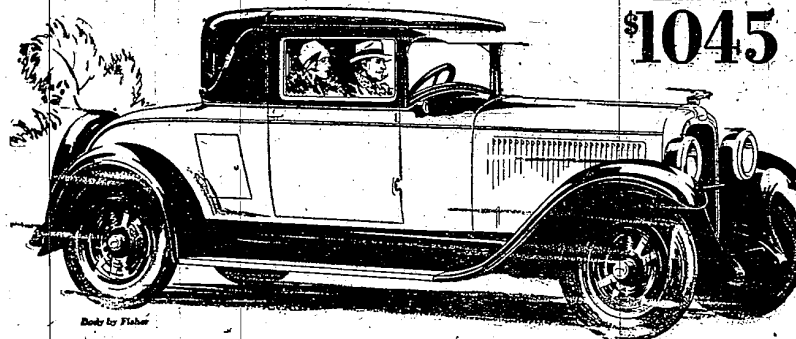
A Station-to-Station call is one that is made to a certain telephone, rather than to some person in particular.

A Person-to-Person call, because more work is involved, costs more than a Station-to-Station call. The rate on a Person-to-Person call is the same at all hours.
