#### REGISTRATION OF ABSENTEE BY OATH

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Sec. 9—Part II, Chap. III.
If any person whose name is not registered shall offer and claim the right to vote at any election of primary election, and shall UNDER OATH state that he or she is a resident of such precinct and has resided in the TOWNSHIP TWENTY DAYS next preceding such election or primary flection, designating particularly the place of his or her residence and that he, or she possesses the other qualifications of an elector under the Constitution; and that owing to the sicknet's or bodily infirmity of himself or herself or some member of i is or her family, or owing to his or her registration, he't she was unable to make application for registration on the last day provided by law for the registering of electors preceding such election or primary election, then the name of such person shall be registered, and he or she shall then be permitted to vote at such election or primary election. If such applicant shall in said matter, wilfully make any false statements, he or she shall be deemed guilty of perjury, and upon conviction, be subject to the pains and penalties thereof.
