Summons having been issued in this cause and been returned that Anthony Tarabusi and Ludovic Tarabusi, two of the defendants in said cause, cannot be found, and it appearing by affidavit that after diligent search and inquiry it has been impossible to serve that said defendants, Anthony Tarabusi and Ludovic Tarabusi for the reason that they are continually absent from their place of residence, IT IS ORDERED, that the said defendants, Anthony Tarabusi and Ludovic Tarabusi appear at the Court Room of the undersigned, 209-213 First National Bank Building, Pontiac, Michigan, at 10 o'clock in the forenoon Eastern Standard Time on Saturday, the 7th day of April, A. D. 1928 and defend the complaint filed in this suit or judgment will be entered by default, and that this order be served or published as required by statute.

This is an action to recover possession of lands held contrary to the conditions and covenants of an executory contract for the purchase thereof, said lands being described described as follows:  
Property situated in the Townships of Novi and Farmington, Oakland County, Michigan, to-wit:  
Parcel 1. The Southeast Quarter of Section 24, Town 1 North, Range 8 East, excepting therefrom lands conveyed by Erastus Ingersoll and wife to Clark Hazard, February 16, 1831, by deed recorded May 26, 1832 in Liber 5 of Deeds, page 311, Oakland County Register of Deeds Office, and also excepting lands conveyed by Theron W. Barbour and wife, to Samuel Jones, Sr. and James H. Jones, May 24, 1859 by deed recorded December 5, 1859, in Liber 67 of Deeds, page 157, said Register's Office.

The above excepted parcels are described as follows:  
A. Land in the Township of Farmington, County of Oakland and Territory of Michigan: Beginning in the Southwest corner of Southeast quarter of Section 24, in Town 1 North, Range 8 East in said Township, and running East on the South line of said Lot 84 rods and 22 links and thence North parallel with the West line of said quarter section to the North line of said quarter; thence West on the line of said quarter; thence South on the line of said quarter to the place of beginning containing as is supposed 84.85 acres, be the same more or less.

B. The following described piece or parcel of land lying and being situated in the Township of Novi, in the County of Oakland and in the State of Michigan, bounded and described as follows, to-wit:

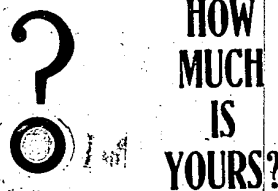
Parcel 2. The East half of the Northeast Quarter of Section 25, Town 1 North, Range 8 East.
