HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS
IN ESSAY CONTEST ON
MASTER HIGHWAY PLAN

Farmington High School students are among hundreds in schools within a twenty-mile radius of Detroit who will compete in an essay contest on the Master Plan of Highways. In an effort to interest the thousands of students in the problem of traffic and road building, the Detroit Automobile Club has announced that prizes totaling two hundred and fifty dollars in gold will be given for the best essays.

This contest is being sponsored by the Road Commissioners of Wayne, Oakland and Macomb Counties, together with County School Commissioners, high school principals and English teachers.

The prizes to be given will consist of: first, \$50 in gold for the best essay submitted by any boy; next, \$50 in gold for the best essay submitted by any girl; a prize of \$50 in gold to be divided \$25 to the second-best essay from either a boy or a girl; and \$25 to the best essay from either a boy or girl from Wayne County, to be awarded after the first three prizes have been judged. The Oakland County Road Commission is giving another \$25 prize for the best essay from Oakland County, to be awarded after prize winners from the entire district have been picked.

The contest will continue until May 1.

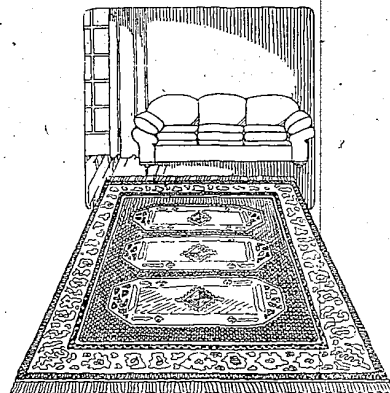

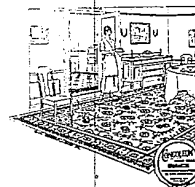

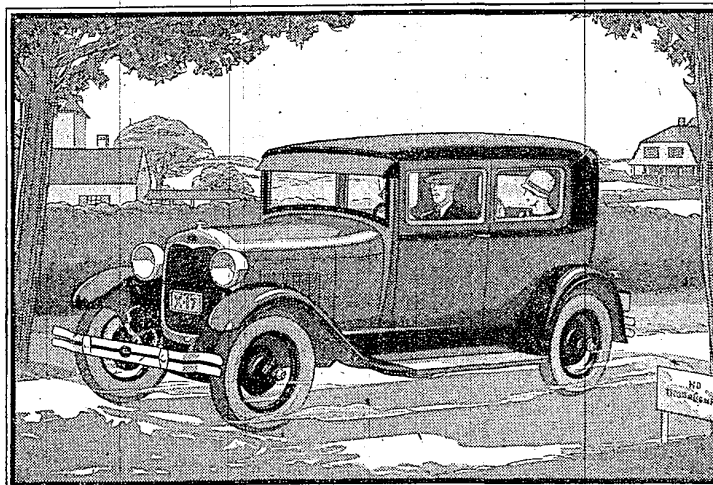
