Although residents of the Union Lake School District voted almost unanimously in favor of a bond issue for \$40,000 for a new school recently, they seem unable to agree on a site. Three proposed locations were turned down at the recent election. Site No. 1, comprising eight and one-half acres, failed by only two votes of the necessary 60 per cent. Sixty-nine votes were cast. The other two sites received less votes than site No. 1.
