DEPUTY STOKES GIVES TESTIMONY AT POISON DEATH INQUEST TUESDAY

Testimony by Deputy Sheriff Clayton Stokes of Farmington played an important part in the inquest at Pontiac Tuesday into the death of K. Reese Fox, chauffeur at the Children's Home of Michigan, near Farmington. Deputy Stokes took care of practically all of the early police work and was one of the leading witnesses at the inquest.

The coroner's jury decided that Fox came to his death from eating cakes in which were rat poison, but afforded no basis for suspecting anyone of foul play.
