COMMISSIONERS PROCEEDINGS

Regular meeting of the Commissioners of the City of Farmington, held May 28, 1928. Called to order by Mayor Butterfield at 7:35 P. M. Commissioners present: Hoyle, Johnson, Gildensetter and Dickie.

Minutes of the meeting of May 21 read and approved. Mr. H. Johnson, as chairman of the joint committee on the Town Hall property presented his report. It was discussed and placed on file and the committee continued.

It was agreed that the City and Township each stand 5 per cent of the cost of flags bought for Decoration Day observance.

There was considerable discussion by the Commissioners and citizens present in regard to the extension of the Ten-Mile road paving. Three plans were under consideration from the standpoint of which is the most practical, the least expensive and of the most benefit to the city. A joint meeting of the City Commissioners and the Oakland County Road Commissioners will be held to settle the question.

The matter of paving certain streets was discussed, and the necessary action to be taken.

A considerable number of citizens were present. The proposed 1928 Budget was read item by item. It will come before the Commission for final discussion and action at the next regular meeting June 4th.

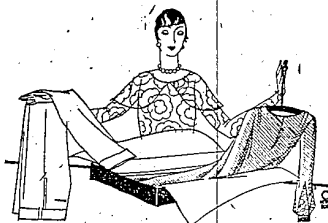
