RE-REGISTRATION IS NOT NECESSARY FOR VOTING HERE

Rule Applies To First Class Cities Only, For Voting On President

Voters in this community need not be disturbed by the thought that they may be deprived of their power to vote at the coming election, because of registration requirements, according to City Clerk N. H. Power of Farmington. The necessity for re-registration before each presidential election applies only to cities of the first class, Mr. Power states. Farmington, a city of the fifth class, is therefore excluded from this rule. Villages and townships are also not affected, it is understood. From reports published in Pontiac and Royal Oak, Oakland County's cities where re-registration is necessary, voters are so lax in registering that hundreds and perhaps thousands will undoubtedly be unable to vote.
