

Proceedings of Annual Meeting, District No. 5, City of Farmington

Meeting held on the 14th day of June, 1928, at High School.

Meeting called to order by President N. H. Power. School laws read relative to qualifications of voters. Motion made by Floyd Nichols, seconded by Howard Warner, that the chairman appoint three tellers. Carried. Hinman Nichols, A. L. Ross and James Hogle appointed.

Nominations called for to fill first vacancy. Floyd Nichols and Blanche W. Ross nominated. Ballot was cast and Blanche Ross declared elected.

Nominations called to fill second vacancy were Florence Lee and N. H. Power. Ballot cast and Florence Lee declared elected.

Nominations called for to fill a vacancy of one year created by resignation of Fred Cook. Lloyd Gullen, Elmer Switzer and B. E. Storms nominated. First ballot no majority. Second ballot cast and Lloyd Gullen declared elected.

Motion made by Mrs. Storms, supported by Mrs. Pierce, that the health service be retained in the schools. Carried.

Motion made by Sayrus Harger, seconded by R. N. Crossman, the Board of Education enter into a lease with the City Commission for property to be used for athletic and park purposes, and that Board of Education spend such money as may be necessary for improvements. Carried.

Motion made by W. D. Butterfield, seconded by E. Evans, that the minutes of all meetings both regular and special held by the Board of Education be published in local newspaper, the Farmington Enterprise. Carried.

Annual Meeting of School District No. 5 Fractional

The Annual Meeting of the School District No. 5 Fractional of Farmington, Livonia and Redford Townships, was held at the Central School on June 11th, 1928, at 8 o'clock.

All members of the School Board with the exception of Mr. Martin were present and about 125 voters.

The meeting was called to order by the President, Mr. Tabor. Minutes of the Annual Meeting were read and approved. Audit of 1926-27 records as submitted by the State Auditor was read.

Motion by Mr. McFarlane supported by Mr. Duckett audit be accepted as read. Twenty-one votes for, and the majority voted against. Motion by Mr. Headler supported by Mr. LaFarge, supported by a firm of auditors, highly recommended to audit the records of 1926-27. Motion carried.

Nomination of School Trustees for three (3) year term. Mr. Headler nominated. Tellers of election Mr. Potts and Mr. Witte appointed. Ballots cast, Headler received 77 votes; Mr. Klint 1. Blank 4; balance did not vote.

School officers salaries: Motion by Mr. McFarlane, supported by Mr. Headler, Secretary's salary be raised to \$200.00 for the ensuing year. Motion carried. Motion by Mr. Headler, supported by Mrs. Billings, Treasurer's salary be raised to \$200.00 for the ensuing year. Motion carried. Motion by Mrs. Headler, supported by Mrs. Getts, Trustees receive \$25.00 same as heretofore. Motion carried. Motion by Mrs. Getts, supported by Mrs. Billings, President receive \$50.00 for the ensuing year. Motion carried.

Motion by Mr. Klint supported by Mrs. Menke rate of High School tuition remain \$125.00 per pupil. Motion carried.

Motion by McFarlane, supported by Mr. Klint, Farmington State Bank remain the depository for the year. There being no further business motion made, supported and carried, we adjourn.
