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MINUTES OF BOARD OF EDUCATION
District No. 5

Special meeting held July 13, 1928 in the High School building. Meeting called to order at 8:04 p. m. by Secretary Frank Macomber.

Election of officers resulted as follows: Blanche Roos, president; Florence Lee, secretary, Arthur Lamb, treasurer; Frank Macomber and Lloyd Gullen, trustees.

Moved by Gullen, seconded by Macomber that Blanche Roos, Arthur Lamb, and Florence Lee act as a building and ground committee with authority to authorize any necessary work on buildings and grounds. Carried.

Moved by Gullen, seconded by Macomber, that the President and Treasurer act as a committee to complete the transactions relative to leasing from the City the ground known as Water Works Park, the said grounds to be used as an athletic field. Carried.

Moved by Gullen, seconded by Macomber that the Secretary be authorized to call a special meeting of the qualified voters of school district for the purpose of transferring all or part of portions of bond issue No. 5 to general fund for disbursement. Carried.

Moved by Macomber, seconded by Gullen, that all bills be first presented to the Secretary and then approved by the Board before paid. Carried.

Moved by Gullen, seconded by Lamb, that twenty-five hundred dollars (\$2,500) be appropriated by the Board for janitor work, the salary of the present janitor to remain as before. Carried. Meeting adjourned.

A special meeting of the Board of Education was held July 19, 1928. Members present, Blanche Roos, Arthur Lamb, Lloyd Gullen, and Florence Lee.

Meeting called to order by the President at 8:00 p. m.

Minutes read and approved.

Moved by Gullen, seconded by Lamb, that the salaries of Board members be as follows: President, \$100; Treasurer, \$100; Secretary, \$100; Trustees, \$35 each. Carried.

Moved by Gullen, seconded by Lamb, that forty-four thousand (\$44,000) be raised by taxation for school purposes for the coming year. Carried. Meeting adjourned.

A special meeting of the qualified voters of the school district was held July 26, 1928.

Meeting called to order by President at 8:00 p. m.

The following resolution was presented by Secretary. Resolved, that the twenty-eight thousand dollars (\$28,000) of bond issue No. 5 be transferred to the general fund for disbursement.

Adoption of resolution moved by Dr. J. A. Miller, seconded by Charles Ely.

Result of vote by ballot, twelve (12) yes, three (3) No. Carried. Meeting adjourned.

A special meeting of the Board of Education was called by President following the special meeting of voters of district. Absent, Frank Macomber.

A petition from the parents of school children living near Base Line road and in Parker subdivision asking that the School District furnish a bus for the accommodation of their children was read and discussed.

Moved by Gullen, seconded by Lamb that the petition be tabled for the present. Carried.

Moved by Gullen, seconded by Lamb, that building and grounds committee be empowered to employ McAlpin-Starr of Birmingham to make a survey of athletic field to determine cost and draw plans for the complete development of field. Carried. Meeting adjourned.

The regular meeting of the Board of Education was held August 21, 1928. All members present. Minutes read and approved.

Harry S. Starr, of McAlpin-Starr, Birmingham, submitted plans for straightening creek and building a track and football field on the athletic field. The estimated cost was six thousand (\$6,000).

Moved by Lamb, seconded by Lee, that McAlpin-Starr get out proposition and obtain bids for grading and track construction. Carried.

Meeting adjourned.

A special meeting of the Board of Education was held August 21, 1928. All members present. Minutes read and approved.

Bids for grading and track construction on athletic field were opened and read by Secretary. Bids received from Mark Wixom, H. F. Klein, and Orville Taggart.

Moved by Macomber, seconded by Lamb that contract be let to lowest bidder, Mark Wixom. Carried.

The second Thursday of each month was set as the regular meeting night of Board. Motion made by Gullen, second-

ed by Macomber that the meetings of the Board be published in Farmington Enterprise. Carried.

Moved by Lloyd Gullen, seconded by Macomber that sign contract and all papers relative to development of athletic field. Carried. Meeting adjourned.
