COMMISSIONERS PROCEEDINGS

Special meeting of the Commissioners of the City of Farmington held October 26, 1928. Called to order by Mayor Butterfield at 7:35 p. m.

Commissioners present, Staman, Hogle, Johnson and Gildemeister. Moved by Hogle, seconded by Johnson, that Amendment No. 1 relative to the cost of paving be submitted to the voters at the election November 6. Yeas, Staman, Hogle, Johnson, Gildemeister and Butterfield. Carried. Bicking and Russell absent and not voting.

Moved by Hogle, seconded by Johnson, that Amendment No. 2 relative to placing names of candidates on the City ballots be submitted to the voters November 6. Yeas, Staman, Hogle, Johnson, Gildemeister and Butterfield. Carried. Bicking and Russell absent and not voting.

Mayor Butterfield desired to vote yes on both amendments. Moved by Johnson, seconded by Gildemeister, that a letter be sent to the Michigan Independent Bureau inviting Mr. Just of that body to instruct the members of our city fire department. It is understood that this will be without cost to the city. Carried.

The Special Committee on the new fire hall reported progress. Plans were submitted on boiler and material for heating.
