Program At Home Of Mrs. M. B. Pierce Followed By Appearance Of "Santa Claus"

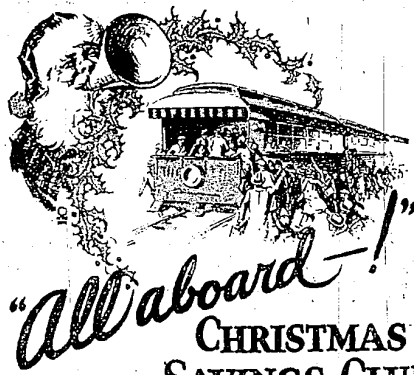
The regular meeting of the Farmington Woman's Club was held Wednesday, December 12 at the home of Mrs. M. B. Pierce.

The club adjourned to meet Wednesday, January 2, 1929 with Mrs. Lou Pauline.

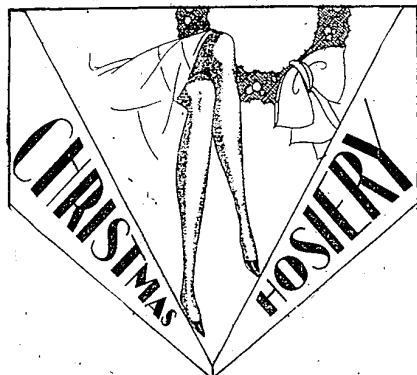

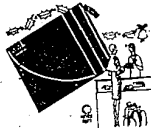
