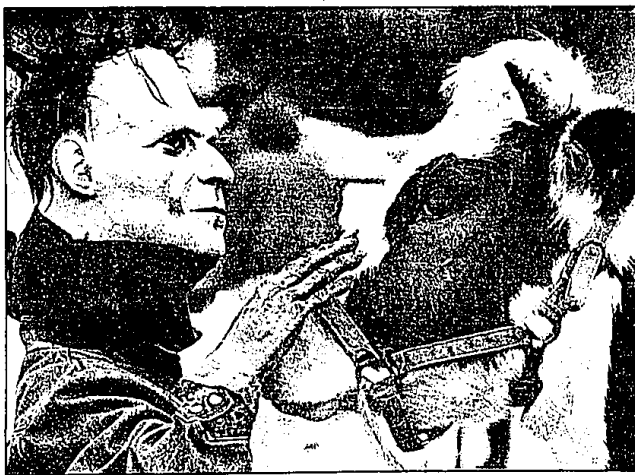

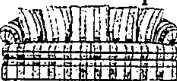

"I didn't know if we didn't have enough or there were more people than we expected," Mitrikeski said. "I think it was more people than we expected."

The same can be said for the Civic Theater. Owner Greg Hohler was pleasantly surprised when 120 people showed up to take in a free showing of "Frankenstein."

"I think that kind of turnout at 11:30 p.m. on a Friday night for a 50-year-old movie that has been shown innumerable times on TV is phenomenal," Hohler said.

A group of high school seniors scored the cinematic coup of the night, though. The first showing of the 30-minute film "The Things in the Woods" sold out, necessitating a second showing at 1 a.m.

The short story was produced by Harrison students Gordon Eick and Jaymz Haynes and Mike Cyruhnik, who attends

North Farmington, and Steven Craine, who goes to Southfield-Lathrup. Some 300 people were in line for the first showing at midnight.

"I have never seen a group of kids so well-behaved," said Hohler, who rented the balcony screen for the showing.

Other merchants didn't directly benefit in terms of sales, but they see the fest as a definite repeater. A woman bought a pumpkin at Michele Mare's Flowers and Co. "It brought a lot of people downtown," said Michele Lapinsky.

Added Village Shoe Inn manager Roberta Grussner: "We had a lot more people come through. I can't say we did a lot more business. Around Halloween, we usually don't get a lot of customers."

"Everyone liked the idea of kids, trick-or-treating in the stores."
