

POLICE/FIRE CALLS

Listed below are some of the Farmington-area police incidents, fire calls and court cases reported during the past week.

VANDALISM

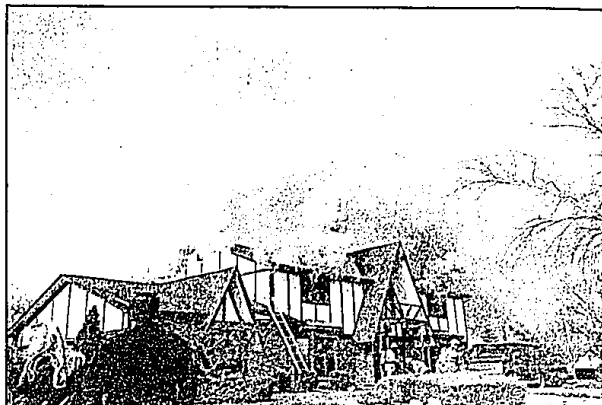
THEFT

The woman said she confronted the father about what was going on, but he did not respond. Police talked to the homeowner, who denied knowledge of any drinking taking place. Police are investigating and are looking into possibility of filing warrants.
