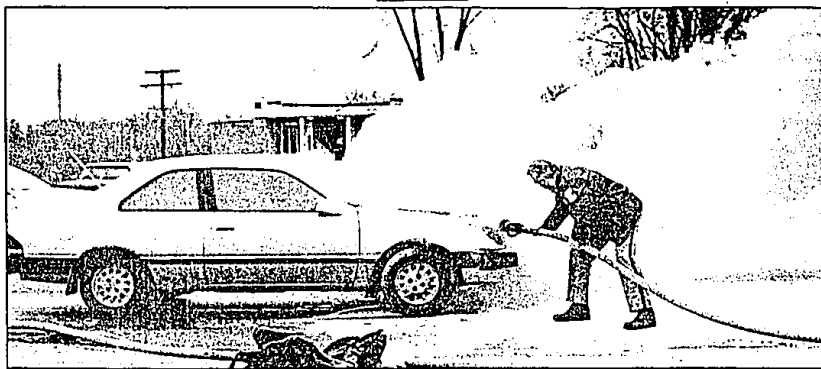


A hot rod

Pre-trial set on gun-grab charge

A Farmington Hills man will face a pre-trial exam Dec. 6 before Circuit Judge Hilda Gage on a charge that he grabbed a Michigan State Police trooper's gun during his arrest in Nov. Oct. 29 on an outstanding warrant for

SLEEP AND DIGESTIVE DISORDERS

Many functions of the digestive system have an important relationship to day-night, sleep-awake rhythms. Acid secretion, motor activity of the small and large bowel, rate of the food emptying into the stomach, intestinal absorption of food, drugs, and toxicity to various medications given orally have all to some degree a variation between day and night hours. Control of acidity is generally easier in the morning hours, since it has been noted that in healthy people and in patients with active duodenal ulcer disease, acid output is highest in the evening and lowest during the morning hours.

Gastric emptying of food and drugs is more effective in the morning. Therefore the effect of various drugs on the lining of the stomach would be less if these drugs were taken early in the morning.

Man gets probation for drug conviction

A Farmington Hills man was sentenced to one year probation by Oakland Circuit Court Judge Frederick Ziem for a second drug conviction.

Michael Dwyer, 30, pleaded guilty to a possession of marijuana charge that resulted from a search of his car in July of 1992.

That search, by Farmington Hills police, came in response to a complaint that Dwyer, who works at a Hills car dealership, had a gun and had pointed it at a man. The dealership, Bob Saks on

Grand River, had experienced several car break-ins. Dwyer had used a fake pistol to scare off would-be criminals.

Judge Fred Harris, of the 47th District Court, had thrown out the original charge ruling that the search for the weapon was a bad search because Dwyer was already in custody and was not a threat. But Oakland County prosecutors refuted the charge.

Because it was the second drug charge within three years, it was considered a high misdemeanor.

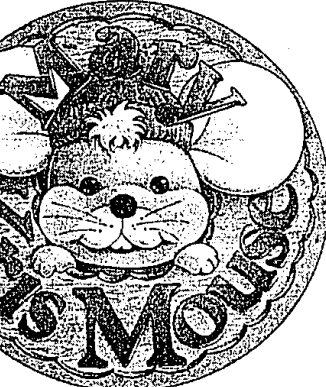
