The five faces included are: an elderly man, an African-American man, an angele infant, an ageless woman and an American Indian,

The sculpture combines Farmington's historical significance as a site on the underground railroad and the Shiawassee Trail which was traversed by the Potawatonic tribo.

Each one of the five columnarepresents 25 of Farmington's 125 years of existence.
