County Budget At \$141 Million

A recommended Wayne County budget of \$141 million is before the County Board of Supervisors for consideration. The budget, as recommended by the County Board of Auditors, is the highest on record \$157 million.

"In general, the level of service programs budgeted for 1956-1959 has been slightly improved and expanded to meet the needs of the community more adequately," the Board of Auditors stated in its budget missage.

THE BUDGET anticipates a \$3,822,000 increase in property tax revenues, reflecting new construction and rising ind values in the county's stare of state income tax revenue; and a \$10,844,000 increase in revenue from grants and service charges and fees for county services.


