Israel Ambassador Will Speak For Bond Dinner

General Itzhak Rabin, ambassador of the State of Israel to the United States and former chief of staff of the Israeli armed forces, will be the guest speaker at the "Bond With Israel Dinner" Thursday, Oct. 31 in Congregation Shaarey Zedek, Southfield.

The dinner will honor Cantor Jacob H. Sosenkier on his four decades of service to Congregation Shaarey Zedek and to the community. Cantor Sosenkier is the dean of Detroit's cantors and has served Shaarey Zedek longer than any other cantor in its 109-year history.

The community-wide dinner welcoming Ambassador Rabin on his first visit here is being sponsored jointly by the Detroit Israel Bond Committee and Congregation Shaarey Zedek. An outstanding military figure who led his country to vic-

tory in the Six-Day War of June, 1967, General Rabin assumed his present diplomatic post in February, 1968. Prior to this, he had been in charge of Israel's air, land and sea forces for more than four years.

Holy Cross Church Women United Offers Film, Plan Plymouth Service Seminar

Two programs of current interest are offered within the next week by Holy Cross Lutheran Church, 30650 Six Mile, Livonia.

The film, "Vietnam Dialogue," will be shown at the church at 8 p.m. Friday, Oct. 25. Discussion will follow. The picture, produced by American Documentary Films, features David Schoenbrun in a history of U.S. involvement in Southeast Asia.

A six-session seminar for adults considering Dr. Hugh Schofield's best seller, "The Passover Plot," will begin at 8 p.m. Tuesday, Oct. 29, in the church.

The subject was chosen through answers to an adult education survey conducted at Holy Cross.

The book, which gives an unconventional interpretation of the life and death of Jesus, will be discussed in the six sessions.

R.H. Read Leaves North Church Post

Dr. Ralph H. Read will leave his position as minister of North Congregational Church, Southfield, to join the faculty of Lawrence Institute of Technology.

Dr. Read will preach his final sermon Sunday, Oct. 27, and the congregation will honor and celebrate his birthday the following day with a church dinner.

DR. READ has completed 13 years of pastoral service to North Church. He was called in 1955 when North Woodward Congregational Church of Detroit transferred to Southfield.

Under his pastorate the membership has more than doubled and the building plan has been completed, culminating in what the National Society of Church Architects has called one of the largest, best equipped and most beautiful church structures in America.

DR. READ was born in Denver, the son of the late Rev. James L. Read, prominent clergyman and early home missionary of the Congregational Church.

HE RECEIVED his B.A. at Grinnell College in Iowa and his B.D. at Union Theological Seminary, New York. He received an Honorary Doctor of Divinity Degree from Olivet College in 1959.

Probation After Death' CS Topic

"Blessed is the man that endureth temptation; for when he is tried, he shall receive the crown of life, which the Lord hath promised to them that love him."

This verse from James is part of the Bible Lesson-Sermon titled "Probation After Death," to be read in all Christian Science churches Sunday, Oct. 27.

Five projects had been authorized earlier: a \$74,000 "seed money" loan to test a prefabricated housing plan using hard-core unemployed workers; a \$101,000 grant for an education center to test new ways to aid children handicapped by early environment; a \$5,000 grant to continue a volunteer program now aiding the poor of Pontiac; a \$30,000 grant to help finance Suburban Action Centers, and a \$37,000 grant to prepare the way for establishment of a college at Wayne University oriented to black culture.

ADF To Attack Excessive Prices In Poverty Areas

Part of the \$1 million plus raised in the 1968 Archdiocesan Development Fund will be used to attack excessive prices reportedly charged in poverty areas.

The committee overseeing spending of the fund has awarded \$18,900 to establish an experimental buying cooperative in the St. Bernard Community school, 11031 Mack, where other pilot projects designed to help the poverty-stricken also are in operation.

Two other approvals of funds were announced.

Expenditure of \$64,430 was authorized to establish Harambee Inc. of Oakland County to test in depth its belief that it is demonstrating new and dynamic methods to meet urban problems, and a \$37,381 grant aid was given community groups to help them make the general public aware of the role of prevailing welfare policies in maintaining the cycle of poverty.

THE AWARDS, made by a committee containing many inner-city residents, were in keeping with Archbishop John F. Dearden's recommendation that promising pilot projects be tested quickly whenever possible, as a means of pioneering new ways in which American cities can meet their problems.

He pointed out that the speed with which the Archdiocese can act—often obtaining a result before a proposal could be given consideration under government rules—is an important ADF asset.

Of the \$18,900 total, \$6,000 will go for the buyer's salary, \$6,000 for secretarial, clerical and other help, and \$6,100 will be spent for office equipment, display materials, buyers' guides and other supplies.
