THE NEW cooperative will start with a relatively small list of goods and services, permitting community needs to determine the shape the endeavor finally will take.

Part of the \$1 million plus raised in the 1968 Archdiocesan Development fund will be used o attack excessive prices re-portedly charged in poverty

The committee overseeing spending of the fund has awarded \$18,900 to establish an experimental buying cooperative in the St. Bernard Community School, 11031 Mack, where other pilot projects designed to help the poverty-stricken also are in operation.

Two other approvals of funds ere announced.

Expenditure of \$64,430 was authorized to enable Harambee authorized to enable Harambee Inc. of Oakland County to test in depth its belief that it is demonstrating new and dynamic methods to meet urban problems, and a \$37,361 grantin aid was given community groups to help them make the general public aware of the role of prelic aware of the role of pre-vailing welfare policies in maintaining the cycle of pov-

THE AWARDS, made by a committee containing many inner-city residents, were in keeping with Archibshop John F. Dearden's recommendation that promising pilot projects be tested quickly whenever possible, as a means of pioneering new ways in which American cities can meet their problems.

He pointed out that the speed with which the Archdiocese can act--often obtaining a result before a proposal could be giv-en consideration under governnent rules--is an important ADF asset,

The basic aim of the Detroit area family groups is to secure either jobs or adequate incomes for all living below the poverty line, as set up by government indings, while guaranteeing those who must accept welfare help the same dignity and respect accorded to other Americans. termine the shape the endeavor finally will take.

The resident buyer, once on the job, will be able to call on the CPA staff for help with specific problems; Once a practical way has been found so that residents of the area can buy "big ticket" articles, as well as the ordinary needs of daily life, at fair prices the appropriations committee will take up another area of high cost, financing of purchases. High-cost credit is another burden helping to keep the poor in poverty's grasp.

Of the \$18,000 total, \$6,800 will go for the buyer's salary, \$6,000 for secretarial, clerical and other help, and \$6,100 will be spent for office equipment, display materials, buyers' guides and other, supplies.
