

Time-sharing, as the name implies, is an actual sharing of the school's time and facilities if a parochial school does not offer a specific foreign language and the pipilig school does, the public school may allow a given number of parachial students to enroll in this observed.

STUDENTS ARE enrolled in the both schools. For one period day, they attend the public school class. They are graded by the public teacher and receive credit there.
