Death Comes Just Before 100-Year-Old Birthday

A Farmington Township great-grandmother died Saturday morning at Ardmore Convalescent Home in Livonia. Slightly more than 12 hours before her 100th birthday party.

Mrs. Ida C. Smith, a township resident for more than 20 years and of the Detroit area since infancy, came to the United States with her parents and older brother from Germany. The trip took 30 days by sailing vessel.

Mrs. Smith, whose daughter

is, Mrs. Adelaide Hensault of the Farmington Junior High School staff, grew up in the Tiger Stadium area of Detroit. She knew the original Fred Sanders and bought one-cent ice cream cones from the local merchant.

Mrs. Smith married the late Frederick C. Smith, a German-born cabinet maker. They made their home on Linwood, near the present downtown Detroit.

Mr. Smith made the first player piano in Garwood, New Jersey during a short period

that the Smiths did not live in Detroit. Trips west of Detroit during Mrs. Smith's childhood required spending nights in wayside taverns.

A trip to Farmington required spending a night in the early Boisford Inn before completing the journey.

Mrs. Smith is survived by her daughter, Mrs. Hensault, two grandchildren, Philip Hensault and Mrs. Julie Patterson, and one great-granddaughter.

Funeral arrangements were handled by Thayer Funeral Home, Farmington.

Leaflets To Cover Area

THE LEAFLET pulls popmunches in itemizing the money needed to operate the center.

On one page the operating

budget is set at \$41,700, the capital budget at \$18,300, making a total of \$60,000.

Plans are to raise funds by selling community center memberships. These are listed as: individual membership—\$5; family membership—\$15; sustaining membership—\$50 and up per year; patron—\$250 and up per year.

Contributions, business and voluntary, are also being sought.

A coupon for contribution is included in the leaflet that is to be distributed.
