## Racism called '2-way gun'

■ On Tuesday, the Rev. Charles Adams, a Detroit minister, helped a Farmington - area audience revisit the dream of Martin Luther King Jr.

It wasn't Sunday and there was a podium instead of the pulpit. But when the Rev. Charles Adams spoke Tuesday, it drew a reaction.

Adams, the longtime pastor of Hartford Baptist Memorial Church in Detroit, discussed the topic "Revisiting the Dream of the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King" before a meeting of the Farmington / Farmington Hills Multicultural / Multiracial Community Council at the Farmington Training Center.

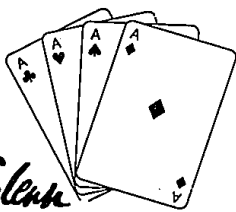
Adams chronicled the history of racism and the continuing disparity between the races in employment, health care, housing and school funding. He called for the need to include everyone and to find a solution to the problem.

Racism, Adams added, "is a two-way gun that spells doom for the user and its target."
