

POLICE/FIRE CALLS

Listed below are some of the Farmington-area police incidents, fire calls and court cases reported during the past week.

BREAK-INS
Two Toshiba telephones worth \$150, a CompuLine computer worth \$1,500, a \$300 Technics stereo worth \$300 and a 13-inch black and white TV worth \$150 were stolen from Professional Psychotherapy on Orchard Lake in Farmington Hills Jan. 7-8. The office door window was broken to gain entry, but cash and other office equipment were left behind.

A cash register (\$450), \$500 in cash, a \$1,300 bottle of Louis XIII cognac and a \$600 bottle of Hardy Noces cognac were stolen from the Vineyards on Northwestern Highway Jan. 7-8.

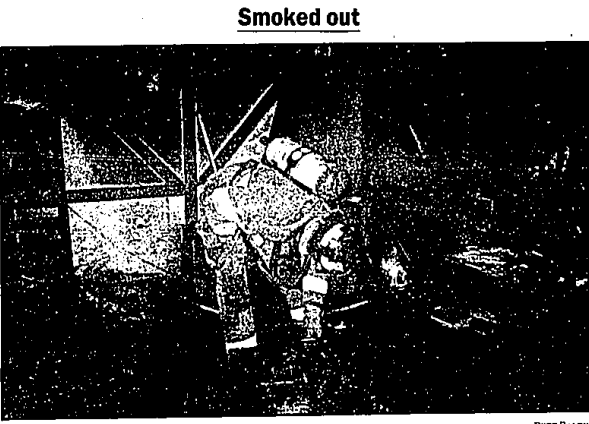

Extensive damage: Farmington Hills firefighter Ben Vaughan looks over the damage from a basement fire that Hills firefighters extinguished early Monday morning. The fire, believed to be the result of an electrical problem, started in the basement but caused \$25,000 in damage to the house on Briarwyke and \$100,000 in smoke damage. Lt. Mike Garr, fire prevention specialist with the department, called it a "minor miracle" that the three residents were able to get out of the house unharmed. A smoke detector upstairs was missing, one on the main floor had a dead battery. But the alarm in the basement went off in time to warn the occupants, he said.

A black leather three-quarter length man's coat (\$350) was stolen from Matt Brady's Tavern on 10 Mile in Farmington Hills Jan. 10.

A black clutch purse with \$450 in cash, credit cards, license and ID was stolen from Marx and Lane on Northwestern Highway in Farmington Hills Jan. 10.

A Coach purse (\$200) with \$80 in cash was stolen from a residence on Colony Park Drive in Farmington Hills Jan. 9.

ARMED ROBBERY

Exam waived in equipment theft

Edsall Franklyn Ellison, 22, waived his exam on charges that he broke into an office building twice and stole thousands of dollars worth of office equipment.

Ellison's bond was continued until he remains in the Oakland County Jail.

The Southfield man will be arraigned in Oakland County Circuit Court on Monday, Jan. 24, at 1:30 p.m. before Judge Denise Langford Morris.

Farmington Hills police arrested Ellison after Troy undercover

officers followed a man into an office building they suspected he was breaking into on Orchard Lake just north of 12 Mile.

Hills officers arrested Ellison at about 8 a.m. Dec. 29 and recovered office equipment that had replaced more than \$68,000 worth of office equipment stolen from the same building on Dec. 19.

Ellison is charged with 14 counts of breaking and entering with intent to commit larceny, a 10-year felony on each count.

Car theft arraignment delayed

Two men accused of stealing a car left running at a gas station while his owner was inside buying cigarettes will wait until Jan. 19 for their arraignment.

Ernest Kir Feltz, 26, and Jerry Wayne Richardson, 34, both of Dearborn were to face a preliminary exam Friday. But Richardson was wanted on an outstanding warrant for drunken driving in Wayne County. He is in the Wayne County Jail.

Feltz, who is free on a personal

bond of \$2,500, had his exam put off until the same date because the two are co-defendants.

The two face auto theft and receiving and concealing stolen property charges, both five-year felonies. They are accused of stealing a Ford Taurus at about 8 p.m. Dec. 28 while the driver, a 35-year-old Novi woman, had gone inside of the Shell gas station at the corner of Grand River and Haggerty.
