Committee: Return kindergartners to Beechview

The kidds are back.

The Farmington Board of Education Building and Site Committee has recommended the kindergarten class return to Brechview Elementary for the next school year. The decision came Tuesday night at a special meeting with parents in Becchview's media center.

The kindergarten class was moved to Alameda Early Childhood Center this year to alleviate overcrowding.

Kimberley Subdivision fought the move, forming the group Concerned Parents Over Beechview Overcrowding. They welcomed the committee's recommendation. "We thank you for at least listening and going with the option of having a kindergarten closs at Becchview," said Mary Nicole, president of the Kimberley Homeowners Association. "What you're saying is school of choice. That's what we want. We don't want to tell our residents you can only go to one school."

School officials said the move was temporary when they made the initial decision last year. At the time, Beechvlow was 90 stu-dents over capacity. In addition to sending the kin-

dergarten class to Alamedo, chil-dren living in Section 13 — north of 11 Mile and east of Middlebelt — were moved to Wood Creek Elementary.

A survey conducted by Alameda principal Gayle Zimmerer found parents of 63 kindergartners said they intend to keep

their children at the school for first grade. Of those, 30 are from the Beechview attendance area.

"If those people follow through, that will free up a classroom," Cowan said.
Also, Cowan noted enrollment appears to have peaked at Beechview. But he was cautious in his report to the Building and Site Committee. mittee.

Cowan said enrollment will still need to be watched closely. Also, he added, Alameda will have to be marketed as a school of choice for kindergarten and first graders. He

asked that one portable classroom remain at Beechview as a precau-

remain at Becchview as a precaution.

Cowan said moving the kindergarten class was justified compared to building an addition —
which school officials said the
district cannot afford — or changing the boundary lines.

"With the kindergartners, the
advantage is you only would be
affecting them once . . . Then you
can bring them back." Cowan
said. "Wo're going to have bleeps
that are going to occur."

Added trustee David York:

"We're going to have to look at no-cost solutions. I don't see us building at the elementary level. We don't know where the money is going to come from."

Other parents wanted assurances overcrowding wouldn't. return. This year, class sizes are averaging 21 students and that has many parents content.

"Choice is healthy," said Mark Persitz, who served on the school's committee on overcrowd-ing, "but not when it's at the price of overcrowding."
