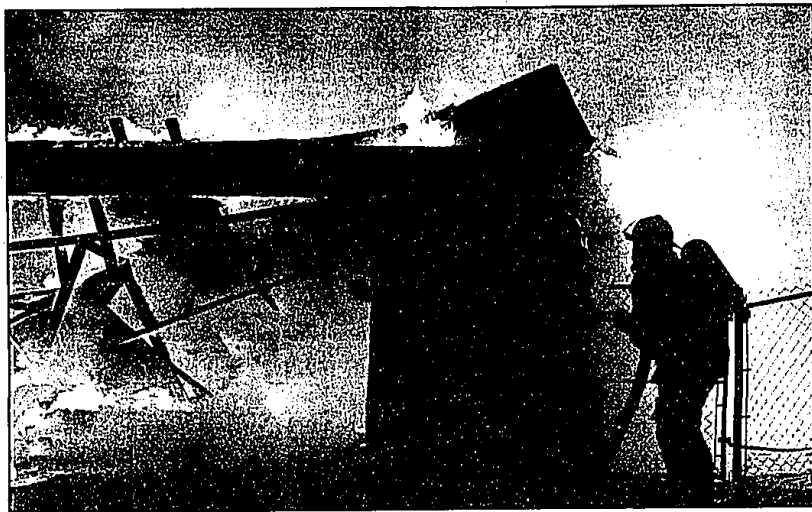


Garage fire in Farmington Hills

Saved the house: Farmington Hills firefighters from Station 1 were able to save a house on Fendt in Farmington Hills from the fire that destroyed the detached garage Jan. 24. The fire, which destroyed the garage (\$15,000) and contents, which included two motorcycles (\$15,000), started in the southeast corner at 7 p.m. when a wood-burning stove used to heat the garage became too hot. Firefighters Mike Kish (left) and Max Anthouard fought the slippery conditions as well as the fire. The homeowner was able to remove his car and two snowmobiles from the garage.

POLICE/FIRE CALLS

Listed below are some of the Farmington-area police incidents, fire calls and court cases reported during the past week.

VANDALISM

Farmington Hills Police arrested two Hills men, 17 and 18, after a car had been pushed into a light copper 1983 Toyota parked at Oakland Community College on Orchard Lake in Farmington Hills Jan. 29 causing \$900 in damage.

The side of a green 1994 Toyota Camry parked at the Green Hill Apartments on Green Hill was scratched Jan. 28-29 causing \$200 in damage.

A 32-year-old Milford woman told Farmington Hills police that while she was driving south on Orchard Lake south of 13 Mile on Jan. 31, a white man, 35, described as heavy set, with a beard and mustache and sandy blond hair, wearing a cap, drove his blue Chevy pickup into her 1992 red Saturn from the lane to her right causing \$200 in damage to her front bumper.

A passenger-side window on a 1989 Ford Escort was shot with a BB gun causing \$200 in damage

while it was parked in the Big Boy parking lot on Farmington Road in Farmington Jan. 30.

BREAK-IN

The canvas top of a white 1992 Suzuki parked at the Windemere Apartments on Independence in Farmington Hills was cut causing \$300 in damage, and hockey equipment worth \$700 and a pair of size 8 1/2 Bauer hockey ice skates worth \$116 were stolen Jan. 30.

A passenger side window was broken on a blue 1988 Toyota parked at the Green Hill Apartments on Green Hill Jan. 27-28 causing \$100 in damage and a Bell radar detector worth \$250 was stolen.

A driver's side window was broken on a white 1992 Pontiac Grand Am parked at the Spring Valley Apartments on Spring Lane in Farmington Hills Jan. 27-28 and a Fox radar detector worth \$200 was stolen.

An AM/FM CD player (\$500) and a NEC portable phone (\$155.95) were stolen from a blue 1993 Jeep Grand Cherokee after a door lock had been punched.
