Zonjic to perform with Plymouth Symphony

Canadian-born flutist Alexander Zonjic and his ensemble will perform at the Plymouth Symphony Orchestra concert 8 p.m. Saturday, Feb. 26, at Fuerst Auditorium in Novi High School, 24062 Taft Road, at 10 Mile in Novi.

Tickets are \$12 adults, \$10 seniors and \$5 for students in grades K-12. Call 451-2112.

The symphony, under the di-

Canadian-born flutist Alexander Zonjic picked up the flute for the first time at the age of 21. He has come to be recognized by artists such as Bob James, Earl Klugh and Detroit Symphony Orchestra principal flutist Ervin

Monroe.

In 1990 Zonjic collaborated with Bob James and a host of other established musicians to produce his latest album, "Neon" — a blend of rock, soul, jazz and classical styling. "Neon" is preceded by five other albums, plus a featured performance on Bob

James' album, "Ivory Coast."
