nence.

Otherwise, said David Blake of Simpson Granite, anything smaller than the 4 feet high and 16 feet long requested would make the granite sign look like a headstone.

"This is going to be a tremendous sign," Blake said. "It's not going to be some gas station neon light."

Tupper remained unwavering, saying the reasons were not good enough to grant an exception.

"I just feel it's important to protect our ordinances," Tupper said.

Councilman William Hartsock

agreed, but added in some cases ordinances are not easily applied. He sees this as one of them.

"I also look at the situation as being unique unto itself," Hartsock said. "This is one of those exceptions."

Mark Ziegler of Heeney-Sundquist Funeral Home is involved in the project. Heeney-Sundquist is donating one-third of the money for the \$18,000 sign, which is expected to be completed in June or July.

"I didn't think we'd run into that kind of opposition," said Ziegler, who attended the meeting.

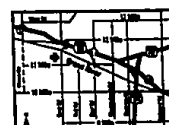

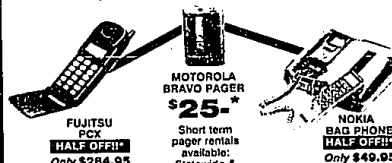
