In the final analysis, Plymouth Salem's loss Feb. 21 to Plymouth Canton in its dual-meet finale may have been a turning point for the Rocks.

They had been performing well. They had been performing well, it's true, but they didn't quite seem up to defending their Class A gymnestics championship. And time was running low, with the Western Lakes Activities Association meet Thursday and the regional and state finals all that re-

gional and state finals all that remained.
The Chiefs' 136.4-135.6 upset victory may have shaken Salent up just enough. No, the Rocks did not put their best lineup out against Canton, but they still could have, wan.
There were no such mistakes repeated in Thursday's WLAA meet at Westland John Glenn. Salem simply dominated, posting the state's best score this season in romping to its fifth-straight league title.

The Rocks finished with 142.75 points, more than a point better than their previous best this season. Canton placed second (egain—the Chiefs' fourth consecutivy gear as runners-up) with a team season-best score of 139.75.

AN ORDINANCE ADAPTING AND CLARIFYING FEDERAL CABLE TELEVISION CUSTOMER SERVICE STANDARDS

An ordinance to specify the normal business bours for the cable company and catabits normal operating conditions. Requires foil free telephone access 2s hours a day and trained representatives be available. Standards for telephone anxwering time are established. Require time for representatives be available. Cable operator shall provide written information regarding service levels to the Southwestern Gakiand Cable Commission. Requires that bills for service shall be clear, conciss and itemized. Civil and criminal penalties may be levied for violations.
