

## POLICE/FIRE CALLS

Listed below are some of the Farmington-area police incidents, fire calls and court cases reported during the past week.

## ■ BREAK-INS

The front bay window at Quality Express Lube on Grand River in Farmington Hills was broken Feb. 23-24 causing \$75 in damage, and \$150 in cash was stolen from the cash register.

A green 1993 Oldsmobile parked at Robert Siegel Inc. on Northwestern in Farmington Hills was broken into and the wires to the AM/FM stereo were cut causing \$100 in damage Feb. 23. The stereo (\$820) was stolen.

A glass door wall was broken out causing \$600 in damage and a pair of women's prescription sunglasses were stepped on causing \$300 damage at a residence on Grand Duke in Farmington Hills Feb. 13-25. A 27-inch Mitsubishi color TV (\$1,000), a \$3,000 brown mink jacket, a \$3,000 full-length woman's raccoon coat, an \$800 three-quarter length woman's cin-

namon leather jacket, a clock radio (\$51.94) and a black Gucci purse (\$420) were stolen.

## ■ THEFT

## ■ ILLEGAL DRUGS

Police had questioned the woman, who had given false identification. They had then found the cocaine in her coat pocket. A field test for cocaine also was positive.

Police had already responded to a call at the man's residence and the two had agreed not to fight. Police came back to the scene after receiving a call from the woman who told them she had been kicked and choked.

## ■ AUTO THEFT

The attempted theft of a blue 1993 Ford Mustang parked at the Gateway Apartments on Gateway in Farmington Hills between Feb. 28 and March 1 caused \$600 in damage to the steering wheel, which was sawed so that "the Club" could be removed.

## Forensic exam is ordered in parking case

Circuit Court Judge Barry Howard ordered a forensic examination for Anita Lusia Tucker of Farmington Hills. She was also bound over for a preliminary court exam on April 28.

Tucker, 25, faces charges of felonious assault, a four-year felony, and malicious destruction of police property, a two-year felony.

The charges stem from two incidents on Jan. 26. Tucker is charged with backing into a police car being used by volunteers in Farmington Hills' handicapped parking enforcement program and hitting one of the volunteers.

She later fled police officers who came to her apartment building parking lot to impound her car.

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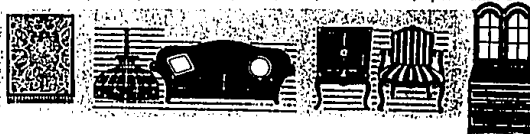
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
