The Clarion Hotel, which had been ticketed in December of 1989, 1990, 1991 and 1993, also explained that it has an extensive employee training program that emphasizes asking for ID. Clarion manager Tom Foraker said they corporation that owns the hotel takes the violations seriously

"We realized why the city is up-set with us," he said. "We're em-barrossed by our record."

The notes takes part in several community programs emphasizing drinking moderation and not selling to minors and had put employees through a detailed training session Nov. 24, just over a month before the restaurant was caught selling to a minor.

"It's a wonderful program," Foraker said of the liquor sting.

"It gives us warning. We posted the letter in 11 different places. It's very frustrating."

Barry Efros, owner of Efros Muirwood Drugs, echoed the frustration of the two larger businesses, calling the December violation "a momentary lapse."

"This was a doozy." Efros said. "And it hurts because we're just a little guy trying to make it in world of chain drug stores."

Efros said regardless of warnings, under-age patrons who wanted boore had nothing to lose by trying to buy, it was up to his complexes to do a better job of carding customers. Efros Drugs had been caught twice on its first day of business in 1986, caught in

The council, which had called for the violators to appear as a possible first step in a process to recommend harsher punishment than that doled out by the LCC, came away satisfied that the three establishments will work harder, and the council of th
