

Kids can make grade in TV production



CABLE CONNECTION In my next life, I am coming back as a junior or senior in the Farmington Public School System. Because of the generosity of MetroVision in providing TV equipment to our high schools, a TV channel allocation of 10 and the high competence of directors Dean and Sue Cobb in using these resources, our children really have quite an opportunity to learn the ins and outs of TV production at an early age.

Last year TV 10 students won national recognition for production of an orange juice music video. Florida's Department of Citrus flew six students and two adults on an all-expense-paid vacation to Orlando for three days.

Our Farmington District is the only one in the state to produce a live news program every Friday at 1:45 p.m., complete with reporter in the field and video footage. The news show is so articulate that it even captured the attention of Channel 7 news as a feature piece. Popcorn Shop, a bi-weekly puppet show, for kids ages 5 to 8, is completely written and produced by students.

Funds for charity are raised on TV 10 every year. This year's 24-

hour radio telethon is to be held in late April. Proceeds will be donated to the American Diabetes Association.

To top all this, the production van provided by the school district has been taken out already times this school year to tape sports events, concerts and also as a teaching tool.

April will mark TV 10's 10th anniversary. According to the Cobb's, "festivities will officially take place next year to commemorate this landmark."


