Investigators: OU fire started in science lab

Investigators have determined that a March 14 fire at Oakland University's Dodge Hall originated in a glessware dryer in a science laboratory, according to OU spokesman Jim Llewellyn.

The university has hired an electrical fire expert, Bill Sadler of Sadler and Associates in Ohio, to investigate further.

The glassware dryer is a large piece of equipment, 3-feet by 4-feet, used to dry glass laboratory equipment.

The fire destroyed a laboratory on the third floor, damaged a lab on the fourth floor and killed 140 Mongolian jirds that were being used in the research of professor John Yates. (Jirds

are cousins of gerbils.)
Llowellyn also said two white
rats were also killed in the fire.
Twenty-eight jirds remain of
a pre-fire group of 168. He was
using the jirds in vaccine research for elephantissis, a disfiguring disease that afflicts
about 100 million humans
worldwide.

Yates said the death of the jirds sets back his research about one year. "Next March we'll be back to the point we were sitting on last Monday," he said.

Yates' research is funded by a grant from the National Institutes of Health.

An estimate of the cost to re-pair the damage was still being figured out at press time.

Dodge Hall was closed for three days following the fire, but re-opened Friday, March 18.

Oakland University is south of Walton Boulevard between Squirrel and Adams roads. The main part of the campus is la Auburn Hills, and the rest of it is in Rochester Hills.


