Tobacco Education: By a vote of 353 for and 70 against, the House adopted an amendment re-quiring schools receiving funds un-der the Elementary and Secondary Education Act to instruct against excelled fust on those of selections. Hawati: By a vote of 203 for and 213 against, the House refused to kill a federal education program that spends 513 million annually to instruct Hawailans in their native cutture. Sponsor John Boebner, R-Ohlo, said: "This program benefits one group of people. It does not benefit the nation as a whole. Nor does it advance the national education concerns..." #### Felons must pay for lab testing

Gov. John Engler has signed into law a bill to make felons pay for the forensic lab tests required to convict them.

"Mandating criminals to pay for tests required is only fair and will case the financial burden on many Michigan cities," said Engler as he signed House bill 4245. State police and the city of Detroit run forensic labs, which do drug analyses, toxicology analyses, caminations of fingerprints, micro-chemistry, serology and firearms tests.

To Block Cut: By a vote of 49 for and 43 against, the Senate tabled (killed) an amendment cuting nearly in half the projected \$2.8 billion, two-year cost of a bill \$6.4 to increase the global competitiveness of U.S. companies. Under the bill, the Commerce Department and National Science Foundation would use government funds to boost certain technologies and industries regarded as important to American economic growth.

Ernest Hollings, D-S.C., voted to kill the amendment, saying it would eliminate money for a national information superhighway.

Sponsor Hank Brown, R-Colo., said his amendment would bring the Senate bill in line with the \$1.3 billion cost of its House counter-
