

CC-Rice in rematch

Redford Catholic Central reached the state championship in lacrosse for the first time last year, losing in the final seconds to Birmingham Country Day 9-8.

The two teams meet again at 4:30 p.m. Tuesday at CC in a regular-season game that is sure to show how capable the Shamrocks are in 1994. CC coach Jim Ryan lost all of his starters to graduation except for first-team all-state senior goalkeeper Alex Alviar and senior midfielder Jeff Lachapelle.

"I can tell you what we'll be like after Tuesday," Ryan said.

The Shamrocks have made steady improvement in Ryan's first three years as coach, finishing 11-5 in '91, 12-4 in '92 and 17-2 last year.

CC started the '94 season with a 6-2 win at home over Hilliard High School of Columbus, Ohio. Lachapelle led the win with three goals and an assist. The Shamrocks resume play this weekend with two games in Chicago.

"We've got a lot of different talent, guys who have won a lot of different things," said Lachapelle, who has been a state champion with the CC football and hockey teams. "If we step up and play to our potential, we can have a good year."

Graduation took its toll on CC at every position but goalkeeper.

The most obvious loss is All-American Brian Rice, an attacker who plays at Michigan State University. The Shamrocks also lost attackers Brian Ronayne and Justin Ronayne and Jamie Ronayne to graduation.

Ryan is hoping senior Matt Griffin can pick up some of the

scoring responsibility as an attacker with help from senior captain Mike Avey and senior Chris Teller.

The midfield is expected to be a formidable area for the Shamrocks despite the graduation loss of second-team all-star Paul Nemec and Tim Knott. Lachapelle returns as a midfielder and will be joined by senior Jon Heady and junior Jason Hubenschmidt.

Ryan said much of CC's goal-scoring could come from the midfields.

"They attack, they're athletic and have shooting ability," Ryan said. "A lot of the time your midfields are tough guys who come up with ground balls and pass it to the scorers. This year, they can be the feeders and score."

Ryan also has a line of middies who will come in at 4:30 and concentrate solely on defense: seniors Dave Beardsley and Adam Borchert and junior Dan MacArthur.

The Shamrocks lost their three defenders, Mike Arlen, Terry Griffin and Joe Lopez to graduation. Griffin was second-team all-state and Lopez was named first team all-state.

The defensive starters figure to be seniors Jon Wolfe and Rob Cox and junior Matt Marchel.

Alviar was first-team all-state last year and has improved considerably, according to Ryan.

"Alex works all the time on his game in the off-season," Ryan said. "You can see him in the winter, out in the cage, pretending people are shooting at him. Hand action is important, and he works hard at it."

Mercy romps to win

Juniors Julie Angell and Eileen O'Connell and sophomore Amy Buhl paced host Farmington Hills Mercy to a 101-40 win over Riverview Gabriel Richard in its first dual track meet Tuesday.

Angell won the high jump (4-6) and 1,600-meter run (6:34.8), and she teamed with O'Connell, Laquette Freeman and Melissa Tluczek to win the 3,200 relay (4:53.4).

O'Connell won the 400 run (1:04.9) and helped the Marlies take first place in two other relays.

She anchored the 800 team, which included Terrie Smith, Brandy Johnson and Freeman and posted a 2:00.3 time. O'Connell, Emily Rottinghaus, Kate Sharkey and Johnson gave Mercy the win in the 3,200 relay (11:20.9).

Buhl was a double winner, with first in the 100 hurdles (17.9) and 300 hurdles (59.3). She also anchored the winning 400 relay

and was second in the high jump (4-6).

Smith won the 200 dash (30.7), and Freeman the 100 (14.4), and both combined with Johnson and Buhl to win the 400 relay (59.0).

Tluczek and Rottinghaus also were individual winners in the 800 (3:02.6) and 3,200 runs (13:31.5), respectively, as were Renee Arceno in the shot put (31-11) and Candice Turpin in the long jump (13-11.4).

The Marlies got second place from Sharon Agacinski in the 800 (3:02.8), Tluczek in the 1,600 (6:39.0) and Sharkey in the 3,200 (14:37.2).

"For the first meet and given the weather (cold and rainy), I thought we did a good job," Mercy coach Gary Servais said. "We had a lot of people in areas they don't normally run, and I was happy with the way they stepped in."
