

POLICE/FIRE CALLS

Listed below are some of the Farmington-area police incidents, fire calls and court cases reported during the past week.

AUTO THEFT

A dark blue 1981 Chevy Monte Carlo with \$4,000 was stolen from the Cedar Ridge Apartments on Tulane in Farmington Hills April 7-8.

PROWLER

A 28-year-old Farmington Hills man was arrested after a two-minute struggle with Farmington police officers April 9 near Freedom and Tree Hill. The man tried to run after police found he was wanted on outstanding warrants in Redford Township. The man gave officers a different name when they confronted him after responding to a call about a possible prowler. The man said he knew the resident whose door he was knocking on, and the person was calling him a cab. The resident said she did not know the man. When the name of the man didn't register in a computer check, police found out his real name. A subsequent check revealed the outstanding warrants. The man became violent when police tried to subdue him, even using chemical freeze during the struggle. He is charged with prowling, giving false identification and resisting arrest.

Hills man performs with orchestra

John Gage of Farmington Hills was the featured marimba soloist March 20 with the Birmingham-Bloomfield Symphony Orchestra, conducted by Charles Greenwell.

He performed two movements from the Marimba Concertino by Mayuzim. Greenwell was one of the BBSO's two 1993 Senior Division Scholarship Award winners chosen to perform with the orchestra as a result of his audition for Felix Reanick, music director and conductor.

Last year Gage was the recipient of first-place scholarship awards from the Farmington Musicals, Farmington Community Band, and was judged the out-

standing high school percussionist in Michigan based upon his proficiency ratings in state competition on tympani, marimba and concert snare drum.

A 1993 graduate of North Farmington High School, Gage studied percussion with James Covick. He was the percussion captain of the NFHS Marching Band, and principal percussionist of the Symphony Band, the Percussion and Steel Drum Ensemble, and the Oakland Community College Percussion Ensemble.

He also was a member of the percussion section of the Farmington Community Band for five years.

Gage was awarded a five-year music scholarship to Central Michigan University, where he currently is a student of Professor Robert Hohner, chairman of the Percussion Department.

Gage is a section leader in the CMU Symphony Band, and performs with the Jazz Band and with the nationally recognized CMU Percussion Ensemble.

As a member of the Drum Line of the CMU Marching Band, he also performed in national marching percussion competitions this past year in Columbus, Ohio and Indianapolis, Indiana.
