JOHN A. CHURCH

Born in Flint, Mr. Church graduated from Detroit Catholic Central High School and later returned to teach and coach there. He graduated from Assumption College in Windsor, Ontario and completed his master's degree at the University of Detroit.

Mr. Church taught and coached at St. Michael's in Toronto, Ontario in the late 1940s and early 1950s. He taught junior and senior high school mathematics in the Detroit Public Schools 1954-1968. He coached basketball and taught mathematics and computer science at Detroit Catholic Central High School, Marygrove College in Detroit, Madonna Uni-

versity in Livonia, Macomb Community College and since 1979 at Oakland Community College in Farmington Hills.

Mr. Church enjoyed teaching immensely and strove to make the classroom experience interesting with real world examples and humorous anecdotes. He would often comment that all good teachers and coaches are made up of equal parts knowledge, experience and good humor.

After learning of his cancer Mr. Church continued teaching evening courses at area colleges and began a second full-time career as a systems analyst and computer programming trainer at Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Michigan. He retired from BCBS and accepted a similar position with Manufacturer's National Bank. He accepted early retirement from Comerica in 1993 and had since been working as a graphic artist with his two sons at Cashel Design in Farmington.

Mr. Church was an aviation-history and model-airplane enthusiast. He also enjoyed golf and art related activities.

Survivors include his wife, Elizabeth; sons, John and Thomas; daughters, Beth, Mary Catherine and Anne; and three grandchildren.

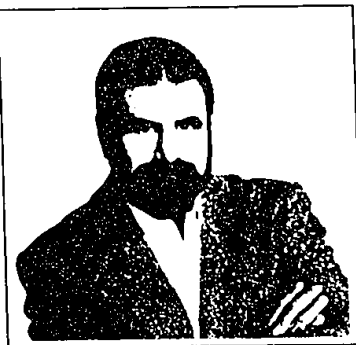
