

American Legion offers scholarships

American Legion Post 390 in Farmington will provide six \$500 scholarships to seniors at Farmington, Farmington Harrison and Farmington high schools.

They are to be awarded to one male and one female student at each school.

Those receiving the gifts will be selected by the school council, with the selection subject to approval of the scholarship

committee and the American Legion post commander.

Students must meet the following requirements:

- Have serious college ambitions.
- Be accepted by an accredited school of their choice.
- Have a parent or grandparent who served honorably or currently in the United States Armed Forces.
- Maintained a 3.0 grade point

average in high school.

■ Are not receiving more than \$1,000 from another scholarship.

■ Show a need for financial assistance.

In addition the Legion will provide up to six \$500 scholarships to the children or grandchildren of persons who have been a member of Farmington Park Post 390 or its Auxiliary for a period of three years, limited to one scholarship per member per year. Students

are subject to the requirements listed above.

Scholarships will be for first year or freshman year of school only. Monies will be paid directly to the school upon receipt, from the student or school, verification of acceptance, and the student's ID number.

Seniors interested should contact their counselor and submit an application.

The council has also decided to design and building firms into the project since they will be less likely to have cost overruns.

The project would cost no more than \$6 million and be financed with a bond issue.

Despite exhaustive studies show the arena will be profitable, the council members agree that it could lose in the long term. That prospect could lead to turn off voters on

the idea, Oliverio said.

Rather than ask taxpayers to back something that could cost "even \$2 a year" each, Oliverio and Sever said going back to the voters to renew the recreation bond early might make more sense.

"Everyone I've asked has said they want the ice arena, but they don't want more taxes," Oliverio said.

Oliverio's alternative would have voters decide whether to ex-

tend the millage, scheduled to run out in 1998-99, for up to 15 years. That way, taxpayers would not have to pay more, but would continue paying the recreation tax they approved twice already. It would provide money for several projects, including a swimming pool, and provide money to cover a possible shortfall of up to \$200,000 for the first year and \$150,000 for three more years on the arena if it were not profitable for the first four years.

After the meeting, Sever said that with a long-term recreation bond, the city could eventually reach the point where the arena, a pool and other projects could not only be paid for, but their operating expenses would be covered and they would eventually make money for the city.

Although the council has the option of using building authority bonds, which don't require voter approval, the council agreed that it will seek voter approval.
