"People and pets who live or work mear or enter wooded or marshy areas are most at risk to contract Lyme disease because these areas are home to the tiny tick that can carries a special kind of bacteria," said Dawn Hafeli, program directr. "When the tick bites, it can pass along the infection that causes Lyme disease."




