**REFLECTIONS SNAP**  
Wood Creek Elementary fourth-grader Ryan Dadey has been selected as the second-place Intermediate Division winner in the 1993-94 Michigan PTA Reflections Program in the area of photography. Dadey won first place in photography in the Farmington PTA Reflections competition in March. Dadey, along with other first-, second- and third-place finishers, will be honored April 30 during the state convention in Lansing. There will be a recognition ceremony and a reception. This is the second year that Dadey has won first place in the photography segment of the Reflections competition at Wood Creek.

**ACCREDITED**

## School district to kick off soccer camp in August

The Wil Coerver coaching method will be used. Campers are grouped by age and ability with a player-coach ratio of one to 10.

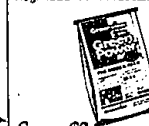

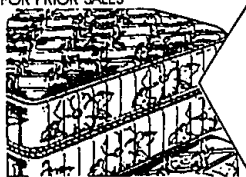
