

POLICE/FIRE CALLS

Below are some of the Farmington-area police incidents, fire calls and court cases reported during the past week.

BREAK-INS

A radar detector worth \$200 and a Sony CD player worth \$300 were stolen during the break-in of a white 1991 Dodge Spirit at the Mulwood Apartments on Verdant in Farmington Hills April 28-29. The driver's side door lock was punched and the window was broken, causing \$300 in damage. A patrol radar detector (\$200) was taken from a 1991 Ford Taurus at the Polo Club Apartments on Polo Club in Farmington Hills April 29 after the driver's window was broken out, resulting in \$250 in damage. A doorwall was pried open (\$50) and \$700 in cash was stolen from the Polo Club Apartments on Polo Club April 29-30.

A black 1993 Pontiac Bonneville parked at Loehmann's on Orchard Lake in Farmington Hills April 30 sustained \$750 in damage during a break-in in which an AM-FM cassette stereo (\$850) and prescription drugs (\$85) were stolen.

The passenger side window of a white 1994 Pontiac Grand Am parked at Ron Daniel Salon in Farmington Hills was broken (\$200) and an AM-FM stereo (\$300) was stolen.

A window was broken and two key boxes and three cabinets damaged (\$300) during a break-in at Exotic Rubber on Grand River in Farmington Hills between April 30 and May 2 in which \$400 in cash was stolen.

The left rear cargo window of a blue 1993 Dodge Caravan parked at the Cordula Apartments on Cordula in Farmington Hills was broken and a \$1,000 Mydata laptop computer was stolen May 1-2.

The driver's door lock of a white 1986 Buick Skylark parked at the Woodhull Apartments on 12 Mile in Farmington Hills was punched (\$200) during a break-in May 1-2. The owner could not immediately determine if anything had been stolen.

VANDALISM

DRUGS

Farmington Hills police arrested a Detroit man, 25, and a Flint woman, 20, for possession of marijuana May 2. Police saw the couple parked in a burgundy 1987 Chevy Cavalier at the Shell station at 12 Mile and Middlebelt at 4 a.m. Police found a marijuana cigarette on the dash, two marijuana cigarette butts in a "Tic Tac" box, 6 ounces of marijuana in one plastic bag and one ounce of marijuana in another. Police also found two two-way, hand-held radios, a pair of binoculars, a nunchaku (weapon), survival knife and a tape recorder. Police had been investigating a break-in at the Gateway Apartments and saw the car pull out of that complex. Police also found a check from a Gateway resident made out to "cash" for \$265. The woman told police she had been doing a "strip show" for the resident.

THEFT

Farmington Hills firefighters from Station 4 arrived at a house on Glouster in Farmington Hills and helped a resident put out a fire in his 1988 Ford Thunderbird. The man had been using a garden hose to put out the fire in the passenger compartment of the car. The fire, which caused \$4,000 in damage to the car and \$100 in damage to contents, is under investigation.
