

Hawks win key dual; Marlins coast

Devon Kennedy starred for Farmington Hills Harrison Tuesday, leading the Hawks to an important dual-meet victory over host Northville, 73-54.

Kennedy won the 100-meter dash (13.3), 200 (27.7) and 400 (1:01.8), and she initiated a Hawks victory in the 1,600 relay. Kennedy, Jenny Lapinski, Margie Ward and Nikki Herman combined for a 4:27 relay time.

Allison Noe was a double winner with firsts in the 800 (2:34.3) and 1,600 runs (6:02).

Amanda Berg won the shot put (33-9 1/4), Nichelle Howard, 100 hurdles (17.4); Patti Dixon, 300 hurdles (51.7); and Erin Schwartz, 3,200 run (13:27).

The Hawks, competing without Krista Snow because of a back injury, are 3-0 in the Western Division and the Mustangs 2-1. Harrison is 3-1 overall.

"We knew it would be close, and we tried to rearrange our line-

up to score the most points we could," Harrison coach Mark Babcock said. "The girls ran well today; we had some gutsy performances."

The Hawks swept the 1,600 run, and they took first and second in both hurdle races and the 400.

"It was a meet we really wanted to win, and those things helped a lot," Babcock said.

MERCY ROUTS REGINA
Amy Bull won three events and Eileen O'Connell had four firsts Tuesday as host Farmington Hills Mercy trounced Harper Woods Regina 97-31 in girls track.

The Marlins are 2-1 in Catholic League dual meets and 3-1 overall. Bull won the 100-meter hurdles (17.1), 100 dash (13.6) and 300 hurdles (55.4).

O'Connell had individual wins in the 400 run (1:04.3) and the 200 dash (27.9).

LaQuette Freeman, Brandy Johnson and O'Connell combined with Tarrin Smith to win the 800 relay (1:55.9) and Amy Freund the 1,600 relay (4:32).

Renee Arcene was a double winner in the shot put (34-8 1/4) and discus (100-11). Julie Angeli won the high jump (4-8), Lisa Nobles the 1,600 (5:56.3) and Mary Threase the 3,200 (12:58.6).

Freund, Johnson, Freeman and Smith completed the winning 3,200 relay team (11:24.8).

"It's good to see some of the younger kids starting to develop and some older ones getting back to form from late last season," Mercy coach Gary Sarvala said.

"We ran a lot of kids in different events today and still scored real well."

The Marlins also made a good showing Friday at the Jackson Invitational, finishing second behind Grand Blanc (98) with 86 1/2 points.

Defending champ Kalamazoo Central was third (81 1/4) and Class B power Flint Beecher fourth (52) in the nine-team meet with a regional format.

O'Connell won the 800 run (2:28.4) and teamed with Freund, Emily Rostinghaus and Nobles to win the 3,200 relay (10:18.7).

Mercy also got a first from Texas Cop-

pus in the discus (105-1). Arcene was second in the shot (32-3 1/4). Bull the high jump (4-8) and Freund the 3,200 (11:24.8).

O'Connell was third in the 1,600 (5:57.2) and the 1,600 relay (4:25.8) along with Smith, Freeman and Johnson.

The Marlins captured four fourths: Arcene, discus (96-8); Angeli, high jump (4-8); Freund, 1,600 (5:37.6); and Bull, 100 hurdles (17.9).

ROCKETS TOP FALCONS
In a dual meet started Thursday and concluded Monday, the Westland John Glenn girls defeated visiting Farmington 74-54.

The Falcons won two field events with Andrea Salzer reaching 4-8 in the high jump and Kim Washcock throwing the discus 86-6 1/4.

Tracey Finlayson won the 800-meter run (2:33.9) and anchored the winning 3,200 relay team. Alina Hestak, Laura Luckabier and Alene Cameron combined with Finlayson to win the relay in 11:37.9.

The Falcons also got firsts from Amber Beirson in the 100 hurdles (17.2) and Annmarie Grimaldi in the 1,600 run (6:05).

we can sneak in here or there," Magni said.

The Farmington teams will be fully represented. Their city meet was the same day last year, but Harrison still scored 24 points and finished seventh with only a handful of runners.

No Farmington school has won the meet since Farmington High won the first Observer-Led Relays in 1971. Harrison — with good throwers, hur-

dlers and sprinters — could be the first in 23 years.

"This year, for sure, we're going to bring our full team and try to be competitive in every event we can," Harrison coach John Reed said. "I think we have a chance, but this looks like a tough meet."

"If we have a good team effort, we should do well. We're not going to try to win the meet necessarily but do the best we can; if we win, so much the bet-

ter."

Scott Gurke, Steve and Nick Shaleb, and Brock Gove make the Hawks competitive in the shot and discus. Led by Tom Sokol, Harrison could fare well in the hurdles, too.

But it's athletes like Gurke, Jason Granger, Kevin Bryant, Gil Chavez and Ehsan Allou who make the Hawks a force in the sprints.

"(The meet) is good for our kids because every single event has a ton of competition," Reed said. "Our goal is to have our best times, and you only get better with good competition."

"I think we're going to be strong in the sprint relays, and I feel confident we'll have a nice mile relay. I think we can score in all the field events. Our distance kids are doing better, and we have depth in the hurdles."

Joe Leo won the 1,600 run (4:55.7) and Derrick Faunce the 800 (2:04.7), and both teamed

with Mark Leo and Jeremy Short to win the 3,200 relay (8:23.2).
