"When the tick bites, it can pass along the infection that causes Lyme disease," Hafeli

With a few precautions, however, the chances for being bitten by
the tick can be reduced greatly.

If left untreated, Lyme disease can cause serious nerve or heart problems as well as a disabling type of arthitis. Fortunately, ear-ly treatment of Lyme disease symptoms with antibiotics can prevent these more serious medi-


