AP — Though supermarket bakeries offer more whole grain breads than ever, it's unlikely you'll find one that delivers the pleasure of this triple wheat loaf, it contains whole wheat flour and cracked wheat, in addition to reg-ular all-purpose wheat flour. Serve it to family and friends for a weekend brunch or supper, and plan to toast any lef-tovers for breakfast another day.

HONEY AMISE BREAD 51s to 5% cups all purpose

In a large mixing bowl combine 2 cups of the all-purpose flour and the yeast. In a medium saucepan heat water, honey, margarine or butter, and salt, stirring constantly, until mixture is warm (120 degrees F to 130 degrees F). Add to flour mixture. Beat with an electric mixer on low speed for 30 seconds; scrap-

ing bowl constantly. Best on high speed for 3 minutes more. Using a large apoon, stir in whole-wheat flour, cracked wheat and aniseed. Stir in as much of the remaining all-purpose flour as you can.

Turn out onto a lightly floured surface. Knead in enough of the remaining all-purpose flour to make a moderately stiff dough (6 to 8 minutes). Shape into a ball. Place in a lightly greased bowl; turn once to grease the surface. Cover, let rise in a warm place until double (about 45 minutes).

Punch dough down. Turn out




