

Hills woman, Southfield man charged with bank scheme

A Farmington Hills woman and a Southfield man are charged with conspiracy in connection with a scheme in which more than \$10,000 was allegedly withdrawn from area banks.

Julia Harrington, 20, of Farmington Hills, and Laquarius Shakoor, 20, of Southfield, were arraigned May 5 before Judge Fred Harris at 47th District Court. They pleaded not guilty.

Preliminary examination was scheduled for Wednesday.

They are charged with conspiracy to commit false pretense over \$100.

Bond was set at \$5,000 each.

Farmington police arrested Harrington and Shakoor April 19 at First of America Bank on Grand River and Lakeway in Farmington.

A woman, using the drive-through window, attempted to withdraw \$200 on a fraudulent account. A bank teller recognized the driver from a previous incident at a Livonia First of America Bank and called police.

In the Livonia incident, a woman opened an account with a \$20 cash deposit. She returned to make subsequent deposits of \$3,100 and \$2,200 on personal checks from NBD. The NBD checks were later found to be from a nonexistent account, according to police reports.

Later, the woman withdrew \$5,000 from the First of America account. The bank also cashed a \$5,000 personal check on the account written to a man, which also turned out to be fraudulent.

A man is involved in a similar incident, police said. He opened an account with \$25 and deposited \$4,450 on a worthless check from NBD. He later withdrew \$3,700.

Police found a bank book on the woman from Standard Federal. She had opened an account there with \$10 on April 18 and made subsequent deposits of \$3,200 and \$3,600.

Foursome robbed outside hotel

Farmington Hills police are investigating the armed robbery of four visitors from Pennsylvania May 6.

A couple from Mount Pleasant, Pa., and a couple from Youngwood, Pa., had parked their cars and were walking toward the front of the Clarion Hotel on 12 Mile Road when a man came out of the bushes near the entrance at 11:13 p.m. He was armed with what looked like a .357-caliber Magnum and demanded their money and jewelry.

The man, described as black, about 25, 5-foot-10, thin, with white shoes, blue jeans, a black T-shirt, black baseball cap, a black jacket and a diamond earring, also used racial slurs against the four victims, who are white.

He stole \$3,150 worth of cash and jewelry and ran behind the hotel after telling the victims to lie face down on the parking lot pavement.

Ponke murder trial moved to Sept. 12

The trial date has been adjourned to Sept. 12 for Raymond Ponke, who is charged with first-degree murder in the slaying of his wife at a Farmington dental office.

Trial was set to begin May 17 in Oakland County Circuit Court, but Judge Jessica Cooper moved the date in a hearing May 4. The trial date was delayed while Ponke completes psychological testing.

Ponke is accused of beating his wife, Jackie Ponke, with a hammer while she worked at Dr. Alan Bredin's office on Freedom Road Jan. 8.

Ponke is being tested for Huntington's chorea, which takes longer than normal testing, his attorney said. Huntington's is hereditary and can lead to mental illness.

Tests to determine if Ponke is able to stand trial have been completed, but the results are not known yet.

"When we find people who are hardcore gang members, we're going to be hard on them," Lee said.

However, police caution that awareness shouldn't spill over into hysteria.

Dellar said teens join gangs for prestige. Too much attention would feed into the notoriety they're seeking.

"It's a problem," Dellar said, "but we don't want to overreact to it."


Resident Mary David echoed that thought.

"They're still kids," David said. "If it's a nice night, they're going to go out. They're going to roller."


"Don't look at these kids with suspicion. They're not all bad apples."
