move about 5,000 goldfish as well as some other species, said Dan Potter, director of the city's Special Services Department.

The presence of goldfish in the park's otherwise natural pond had upset some people who use Heritage.

Although the city had nothing to do with the goldfish finding a home in the pond, they were becoming a problem. Potter said.

"We don't know how exactly they were put there," Potter said.
"But I've talked to the DNR, and they say we're not alone. A lot of people buy goldfish, and they don't want them for a pet but don't want to flush them down the tollet or kill them."

Once in the pond, the fish

Once in the pond, the fish thrived and multiplied. Most were probably born in the pond, Potter said.

"A female can lay up to 300,000 eggs at a time," he said.
The pond was drained, and the fish were caught and taken away by Tech Agriculture. Depending on how many goldfish the compa-
