ANTHONY N. PRIMOS

Mr. Primos, 82, of Farmington Hills, died May 20 at home. Born in Crete, Greece, he founded Mercury Linen Supply Company in Detroit and retired in 1992 at the age of 80.

He enjoyed gardening and travel, was a member of the Elks Farmington Lodge No. 1980, St. Nicholas Lodge No. 568 P&AM, Alpha Lodge No. 135. From 1933-48, known as Tony Primrose, he enjoyed a career as a tap and ballroom dancer in theater and nightclubs and entertained troops at the USO in downtown Detroit during WWII. He performed with such notables as Danny Thomas, Frankie Rapp, Harvey Stone and blues singer Helen Mathews, whom he married in 1936. They would have celebrated their 58th

wedding anniversary on June 25.

In 1958 he founded the successful Mercury Linen Supply Co. in Detroit. A Greektown fixture since the late 1940s, he was known the honorary mayor.

Survivors include wife, Helen; daughters, Mary Monkiewicz of Northville and Diana Peck of Grass Lake; sister, Sandra Kaledo; brother, George Primos; two grandchildren.

Arrangements were made by Thayer Rock Funeral Home, in Farmington. Funeral services were May 23 at Holy Cross Greek Orthodox Church in Farmington Hills with the Rev. Dean Hountalas officiating. Burial was in Evergreen Cemetery, Detroit. Memorials may be made to Hospice of Western Wayne Co. or American Cancer Society.

MARILEE SMITH

Mrs. Smith, 60, died May 19 at St. Mary's Hospital in Livonia.

Born in Cozad, Neb., she was a graduate of Hastings High School, the Mary Lanning School of Nursing at Hastings College, Neb., and the University of Omaha. In 1979 she received her master's degree from Wayne State University. She worked initially at the Shapiro School of Nursing at Sinai Hospital.

A violinist, she played with the Hastings Civic Symphony. An active member of Metropolitan United Methodist Church she served on the administrative council, in the chancel choir and assisted her daughter with the children's choir. Mrs. Smith was the LPN degree completion coordinator and assistant professor at

Madonna University. She was chosen by the Tegal Foundation to develop and shepherd the LPN program across the United States. Survivors include her husband, William H. Jr., of Lathrup Village; one son, William III, Farmington Hills; two daughters, Susan Paroe of Canton and Lorilee Smith of London, England; mother, Margaret Ann Miller, Clawson; one brother, Duane Miller, Bingham Farms and one sister, Carol Keast of Panora, Iowa.

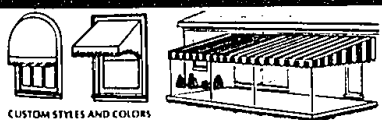
